And our heartfelt thanks to Pink Pine Media who are being equally generous for the new version. What an incredible gesture from both companies!!








You'll be able to find this newsletter and more in the "news" section, where we regularly publish articles.

Sara says; "I am a breast cancer patient since 2012 and living with metastases since 2018. Since living with cancer, movement has become my greatest ally. Exercise helps me ease the side effects of treatments and makes me feel stronger, more present.

In recent years, I have discovered something even more valuable than climbing itself: **the solidarity within this world**. Thanks to Álex from ClimbSkin (a long-standing CAC supporter, Ed.), I have had the privilege of seeing firsthand the commitment and unwavering support of the climbing community — people who, beyond the sport, reach out and strive to make the path easier for others. Being part of Climbers Against Cancer is both an honour and a joy. As a patient, I know that every step, every effort, and every gesture matters. And because, in some way, **we are all still climbing towards LIFE**. Because **the real challenge is to keep moving ahead, keep climbing, and open new routes towards a future filled with more hope.**"

Dani adds; "Since I started climbing in the late '80s, this sport has become my passion and way of life. Over the years, I've seen cancer affect people very close to me — my father, my uncles, friends... Some are no longer here, and my sister Sara continues to face the disease with admirable strength.
